November 2012 RCRC BOD Meeting Minutes

The November 6, 2012 RCRC Board of Directors meeting was called to order by the President at 7:00 PM. All Board members were present.

The Board received notification from Jim Menninger via e-mail to the Newsletter Editor that he is withdrawing as CD for next year's military aircraft event.

AMA document 550 dealing with FPV was discussed. The VP will review the provisions of this document and our field regulations and prepare any changes necessary. Doc 550 is available for review on the AMA website.

The financial information to complete IRS form 1024 was presented by the Treasurer and discussed. This information is part of our application for exemption under sect. 501(a) of the tax code related to our tax-exempt status as a social club. The President will submit the application this month.

The event schedule for 2013 was reviewed and the revised schedule is included elsewhere in the newsletter.

The meeting concluded at 8:00 PM.



At The Field

As previously indicated, this "At The Field" column will address general observations and anything else that comes to mind. If you have any ideas for a topic notify any officer and they will pass it along to the newsletter editor.

Last month's second unsolicited editorial by a current member criticized publishing an anonymous editorial in August, RCRCs criticism of safety at the AMA NATs, use of the newsletter to remind members of our flying field rules, and a perceived militaristic operation of the club and field. It went on to suggest that members' "common sense" might

be a better alternative to rules and regulations that prohibit any particular activity.

Maybe the writer is correct. Maybe it's time to initiate a comprehensive review and rewrite of the Flying Field Regulations. When you look at the regulations it seems that the first 20, or so, concern safety and physical security of our property. The last few have a "play nice" character because of previous inter-personal issues between members.

Since we are an AMA chartered club we are obligated to enforce the AMA's rules, but do we really need anything else? If we do have a need for RCRC site specific rules, do we really need 25 of them? Perhaps the new board of directors will solicit member input toward a possible rewriting of the flying field regulations.



Flying Field Regulations

This month we'll continue our review of the Flying Field Regulations with the ninth rule:

9. Prolonged engine runs will be conducted at the break-in table located at the North end of the field. Prop-wash will be directed away from equipment and aircraft will be tied down or held by the pilot. Tiedowns will be sufficient to restrain the aircraft at full power. The airplane will be monitored at all times. Prop was will be directed away from planes and equipment during short run-ups in the pit area.

Like most of the rules reviewed thus far, this one is pretty straight forward. If you're having trouble with your glow/gas engine and need to run it for any time longer than that required for routine start and taxi, take it to the engine stand that is located at the north end on the parking lot in the grass area.

When you do start and run your engine(s) in the pit area your aircraft must be secured from unintended movement by yourself, a helper, or a mechanical restraint. It is also just common courtesy to direct all prop wash away from people and equipment in the pits to prevent damage and minimize annoyance.
