This action is detrimental to the safety of club, its members and their property as well as voiding the AMA insurance if there is an incident. If a member refuses to sign in and does not obtain a frequency pin this action will be considered as detrimental to the club and the individual's membership will be suspended.

A letter was sent to Lou Hovatter of the city's recreation department with the cost of runway repair.

The board is planning on arranging a meeting wit the director of SWDA to assure that we are being good custodians of the property.

SUBJECT: Rules Clarification meeting held August 11, 2009

DATE: 9/14/09

On Tuesday, August 11, 2009, at 3:00 pm a meeting was held between members of RCRC, the City's Recreation Services, and Legal Departments to discuss and clarify several rules and operation concerns at the Trey Wilbourn Model Airplane Flying Field (TWF). Steve Ivey, Manager of Recreation; Lou Hovatter, Recreation Superintendent; Cissy Cates, Assistant City Attorney; Gloria Branch, Huntsville/Madison County Health Department; Tony Coberly, RCRC President; John Roberts, RCRC Secretary & Jon Lowe, RCRC VP & Programs Chair were present. The Solid Waste Disposal Authority (SWDA) was not represented at this meeting.

The following are rules, guidelines & contract clarifications discussed at the meeting:

- 1. RCRC's contract with the City of Huntsville for use of TWF is a "NONCOMMERCIAL RECREATIONAL USE" sub-licensing agreement which means RCRC will not permit any COMMERCIAL Recreational Use of the property. RCRC may charge reasonable fees for use permits to non-commercial users. The fees may be used to help with cost of field maintenance & repairs.
- 2. Fuel CANNOT be sold by RCRC or an outside vendor at TWF. Fuel of any type CANNOT be stored at TWF. Scheduled event participants and RCRC members may bring enough fuel to use for that days flying.
- 3. A single event banner may be placed at the TWF listing sponsors and thanking them for sponsoring the scheduled event.

- a) Sponsor made banners are considered commercial use of the property and therefore are NOT permitted to be displayed at the TWF.
- 4. RCRC can sell prepackaged foods not requiring cooking, heating or warming such as chips, candy, crackers, cookies, honey buns, etc. without a health department permit. The proper City business license is required.
- 5. RCRC can sell prepackaged, precooked (microwavable) food provided a temporary health department permit (CAT2) is issued by the Huntsville/Madison County Health Department. A portable cleaning station approved by the health department is required. Permit must be displayed for public view.
- 6. For safety reason and SWDA restrictions, OPEN FLAMES from permanent or portable grills are NOT permitted at the field due to methane gas from the Landfill. Any type of open flames is strictly prohibited at the field.
- 7. Vendors selling food or merchandise at TWF are NOT permitted. TWF is for noncommercial recreational use only.
 - a) RCRC may contract with a license caterer to provide meals for participants at scheduled events but the caterer may not collect money from each participant for the food. Caterers must be properly licensed, insured and properly health department permitted.
 - b) RCRC may have pizza; sandwiches & individual dinners delivered to the site for participants and the cost of food can be covered in event registration fees and given away at the event. RCRC cannot sell the food items to event participants without a Health Department Permit to do so and the proper business license from the City and Madison County.
- 8. Outside vendors are not permitted to sell anything on TWF property.
 - a) RCRC may sell merchandise (t-shirts, caps, cups) at scheduled events to promote the event and cover cost of field maintenance with the proper business license from the City and Madison County. Questions concerning the business license please call the City Clerk Treasurer's Office at 427-5093.
- 9. RCRC can provide and maintain soda & stocked snack machines on the property for use by members and guests. Any profits are to help cover cost of field maintenance & repairs.

Other questions that came up during the meeting:

- 1. Why can the quarter midget race track located very close to RCRC's leased property have food and merchandise vendors and RCRC cannot? The track is located on County property and not on an active Landfill. The track property is not restricted by EPA Landfill guidelines.
- 2. Will Recreation Services be able to financially assist with runway repairs in 2010? Due to the City's economic status and budget cuts in 2010, it is not likely the

City will have any funds for repairs. Public Works currently has no equipment to make the repairs.

The clarification of the contract is not a change in the contract. The rules & guidelines listed above are to insure the public's safety, City of Huntsville and Madison County permitting guidelines/restrictions as well as the SWDA Landfill guidelines and restrictions are being followed. Any past interpretation that is contrary to the items listed above are simply incorrect.


