#### March Meeting of RCRC March 17, 2015

The March 2015 meeting of RCRC was held on March 17, 2015 at 6pm. A quorum was not present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call showed all officers present except the vice-president. Three new members were present. It was noted the minutes of the last meeting were in the newsletter. The treasurer reported that the checking account balance was \$4399.44, the money market account balance was \$7677.39, and the Mike Wingo scholarship account balance was \$891.20.

The golf cart was discussed but final decisions tabled until the next club meeting. Drone Day was well attended, around 500, with a net income in excess of \$440. The next event is the Swap Meet, Saturday May 2. Volunteers are needed. Club Day is the following weekend, May 9. The need for publicity was discussed. Monty's Lawn Center will mow the inner grass. Suggestions for signage the day of events were requested. The meeting was adjourned.

A talk on an in-progress kit build, an IM Products Laser 200-45, was given by Tom Wimsatt.



#### Meeting April 1st, 2015, with Parks and Recreation and John Holladay from SWDA

At this meeting, Dan Baldwin reviewed the concerns that were discussed at the previous club meeting (SWDA reps were not present at that club meeting). He explained the special events that RCRC would have, noting that commercial activities would include only those vendors with products associated with RC. He explained the need for a soda machine and portable toilet service. The road problems at the entrance were also mentioned.

Mr. Holladay mentioned that Household Hazardous waste collection is the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday of each month, from 8:00 a.m. to Noon, and that no flying should be done during that time. He said that there would always be a "no open flame" policy. He would like to exchange event schedules with RCRC. And lastly, he will review the city's policies for activities on its other properties and get back with us with details.

Meeting attendees: Dan Baldwin, president and Susan Seaford, secretary representing RCRC. Steve Ivey, Eric Enchelmayer, and David Delisser attended, representing Parks and Recreation, and John Holladay from SWDA.



#### Minutes of Board of Directors Meeting April 7, 2015

All officers were present. The treasurer investigated other means to collect money besides PayPal, such as Visa and MasterCard, but she has been able to find any means less expensive than what is currently being done.

SWDA has verbally agreed to bring our operating rules in-line with the city's rules for other organizations. They are preparing the documentation. Also the city has agreed to mow the inner area prior to special events.

Online banking was discussed. This can help in the retention of club financial records, and in accessing them when needed. A debit card, held by the president and treasurer, will be included in the changes.

The possibility of having a drop-box for current and archived documents was reviewed. They would be stored on a "cloud" server. The website editor will discuss this topic in more detail at the next club meeting.

The plans for the swap meet were reviewed. Cakes Etc. will do the catering. Advance table sales have been slow up to this point.

The golf cart has a bad battery in its bank of 6. It is recommended that all be replaced at the same time. A quote of \$700 to rewire the cart and supply new batteries was obtained. The other option discussed was to buy a refurbished cart for \$1200. Regardless of the option, it is recommended the cart be professionally maintained in the future. This topic will be presented at the next club meeting.

This year's fuel order has arrived from Morgan Fuels. The total was \$632 for 44 bottles of fuel. This an approximate 12% increase in cost compared to last year.

It was reported that we have a volunteer to do publicity.

And lastly, a plan to select a candidate for the Wingo Fund, to attend the AMA Aeromodeling Camp was discussed.


