For your info.

How long does fuel last?

How long does fuel last? If you do a couple of things it will last indefinitely.

1st.When you get finished using your fuel for the day, replace and tighten the cap. This keeps the air that we all breathe from going in and out of the bottle as the barometric pressure changes. Why is this important? Fuel is mostly alcohol, and alcohol has an attraction for moisture (water). The more water in fuel the poorer it performs. Note: A lot of the pilots that use glow fuel leave their fueling cap on the bottle and never seal the bottle. This is ok if you fly a lot and all the time. But if you don't fly over the winter months, you may find that in the spring, when going to the field that your engine may not run at all, or may run poorly. This is probably because of water in the fuel. If replacing the fuel with a new bottle and the engine runs great then the reason was water in the fuel.

2nd. Keep the fuel out of the direct sun light when you are storing it. This keeps the fuel from breaking down.

3rd. If you hold the fuel up to the sun and look through it and see clots floating in it, get rid of the fuel.

P.S. Number 2&3 only pertain to plastic jugs or bottles, not metal cans.

Why am I sure that this works? I have just finished using a gallon of fuel that I bought 30 years ago. I used a couple of tanks of fuel out of it about five years ago and put it back in storage. The remainder of the gallon ran fine this summer.
